

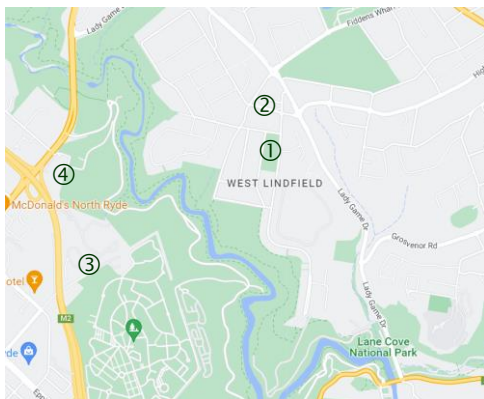
Welcome to the 416 Group

COMMUNITY FIRE UNIT

The Community Fire Unit (CFU) is a team of local residents living in urban areas close to bushland, supported by Fire and Rescue NSW (FRNSW) to enhance their safety and resilience to bushfires.
